

In efforts to successfully host the second annual Bends & Brunch event, HBGO Young Professionals group has partnered closely with Homeward Bound and Chaparral Park to ensure the safety of all attendees and staff. A great deal of care has been considered throughout the planning stages of this event to enhance the safety of all attendees and staff. The event is closely aligned with the CDC guidelines and the current Executive Order signed by Governor Doug Ducey.

To prevent the spread of COVID-19 we ask that you please stay home and join our event virtually if you are experiencing any of the following:

- If you have tested positive for COVID-19 within the last 14 days
- If you have been exposed to someone that has tested positive for COVID-19 within the last 14 days
- If someone in your household has tested positive for COVID-19 within the last 14 days
- Fever or chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

What are we asking that you do while attending our event?

1. Stay home if you are feeling sick or experiencing any of the above symptoms
2. Maintain a safe distance of 6 feet from those not in your direct household
3. Wear a face covering or mask at all times
4. Use the sanitization stations throughout the event or when you come in contact with someone or cough/sneeze into your hands
5. Bring a personal yoga mat or towel to avoid contamination
6. Upon the completion of the exercise portion of the event, please relocate to the food area for your grab n go breakfast

What is HBGO and Homeward Bound doing to make this a safe event?

1. Two waves of the event are set to occur, ensuring the event complies with the maximum capacity of 50 people
2. Providing masks to all in-person attendees and staff
3. Virtual tickets are available for purchase online on the [Homeward Bound Website](#).
4. All attendees have the option to change to a virtual ticket until October 25th
5. The event will be held at an outdoor space, Chaparral Park, to promote safe social distancing
